Internship Description: The River Alert Information Network (RAIN) is looking for an intern to assist in updating and implementing a coherent communications strategy. An ideal intern will be working towards an undergraduate or graduate degree in public policy, communications/journalism, international development/affairs, environmental science, or similar degree. The intern must be flexible in adapting to challenges and remain goal oriented. The ability to work well independently and within a group is essential. Responsibilities of the intern are likely to change and will be commensurate to effort and ability.

Due to the size of the organization duties could change to include grant writing, outreach, website development, and any other duty essential to organizational growth.

Much of the intern's time will be spent remotely, however, candidate must be located in or around the city of Pittsburgh. The intern will report directly to the RAIN Program Manager.

Background: The River Alert Information Network (RAIN) is a regional non-profit dedicated to source water protection. The network serves as an early warning spill detection system with 51 network members throughout the Upper Ohio River Basin and its tributaries. Our members are drinking water suppliers that recognize cleaner source water is easier to treat - ensuring lower costs and safer consumers. The RAIN network continues to grow towards its ultimate goal to provide water authorities, industry, and local communities real time data on the rivers' water quality.
